A **MWHour** (megawatt hour) is a unit for measuring the use of electricity. It is the amount of electricity needed to serve 330 homes for one hour. ## What Really Happened in Texas?

We know that the polar vortex killed Americans in Texas. We know the wind turbines froze. We know the whole thing has been an unmitigated disaster. But there is more to this story. Washington DC has a lot to answer for.

A week before the storm, Texas begged for help and asked for the DOE to lift federal regulations barring the state's energy acquisition. An Emergency Order from the Biden DOE shows Texas energy grid operator, ERGOT, was instructed to stay within green energy standards by purchasing energy from outside the state. This effectively stopped Texas from producing enough power on their own using fossil fuels.

So, Texas ran out of energy. Texas running out of energy is like you or me starving in a grocery store. We would have to want to.

On Sunday February 14<sup>th</sup>, Emergency Order 202-21-1 shows the DOE was aware of Gov. Abbott's statewide disaster declaration, and that he was readying natural gas utilities in preparation for a surge in demand.

The order shows that the DOE did not waive environmental restrictions to allow for maximum local energy output, instead ordering ERCOT to stay within acceptable green emissions standards. So when Texas went to the market to buy more electricity, they were met by the law of supply and demand. Thus the prices they needed to pay began climbing.

On February 15th, the Dallas Business Journal reported "Electricity on the Texas grid has averaged \$1,137.33 per MWHour so far in February. This is up from \$18.20 per MWHour in February 2020. A jump of 6,000 percent. Days later, the Public Utility Commission of Texas set prices at \$9,000/MWHour.

The DOE Emergency Order shows that the Biden administration ordered ERCOT to throttle its energy output by forcing it to comply with green energy standards, knowing full well that Texans could (*ed. and did*) freeze to death in their homes.

#### My take:

I don't know what is more maddening. The DOE making dangerous demands, or Texan leadership kneeling down to those demands. Texans needed to say no to the federal government. We all need to say no to the federal government when they overstep their place in our lives.
