We were not allowed to ask questions or refute anything about the Party or it's platform. Even though we were never told what that platform was! Most adults really had no idea either, they just followed the party because they were told to do so by community leaders, family, and friends. To stray off of the plantation put you at risk of exclusion.

I had questions and I needed answers. So, I began to speak up at an early age. I questioned why Blacks were so loyal to a party that violated everything that we were taught as moral and Christian values. Most Blacks are very Conservative. It just didn't make sense to me. It was confusing to say the least.

My mother taught us Conservative values along with sound Biblical Doctrine. However, what she taught us was in direct opposition to the principles of the Democratic party platform. I'm not even sure if she realized that. She held to a 'party first' principle.

As a child I was taken to church almost every day of the week, and it wasn't an hour-long service either! They had church till the cows came home. When I questioned the preachers about why they were Democrats, they always told me that they should never give people too much knowledge because if they did, they wouldn't be needed any longer. They said that it was necessary to keep people in darkness so that they would always be respected and be able to maintain a position as a community leader. We would sit in church for hours upon hours as we heard the Word of God delivered to us with a mixture of politics in a very biased way. It didn't make sense to me, because it was like trying to drive a square peg into a round hole.

As you can imagine I got into a whole lot of trouble questioning authority, at home and abroad. To make a long story short, I ended up with a pretty sore behind, and a lot of hurt feelings, as well as a lot of time spent in isolation. I learned the meaning of the phrase "a hard head makes for a soft behind."

I was a target of verbal and physical discipline at home, at church, and in the neighborhood. I was called a heretic, a traitor, and was told to keep quiet. Many of the church leaders told me that I had the "Letter of the Law" but "no Spirit".

I eventually had to leave home and my congregation, to search for the truth. I enlisted in the military, but things were not any better there, because the Blacks that I encountered were of the same mindset, and were also blind followers of the Democratic Party. I sat down for hours with many of them discussing why they thought that I should be a good Democrat and keep quiet. They never listened to my point of view because they told me that it was coming from a "white man's" perspective, and that I was not black enough.

I was labeled an Uncle Tom, Mr. Goody Two-Shoes, a White man in a Black body; and I was targeted for ridicule. I was even told that they we're going to kill me if I did not conform and remember where it was that I came from.

After four years I returned home. Things hadn't changed. Friends and relatives were still Democratic zombies. They continued to harass me. I continued to be a thorn in the side of the church leaders in town, and became the target of rebukes from the pulpit, with no opportunity to refute them. I spent a lot of time in my youth trying to reconcile this affection for their blind allegiance to the Democratic Party. I have never gotten any satisfactory answers, just ridicule, and rebuke.

I finally decided to walk away from it all and become a free thinker. It was the best thing that I have ever done in my life. A heavy load was lifted away. I thank an older fellow co-worker for helping me see the light. It hasn't been easy.
