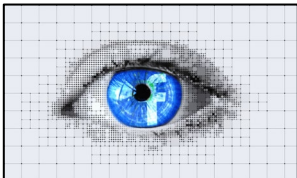

A few issues ago, I quoted Thomas Sowell, that wonderful economist who I have been following for many decades: **"It is hard to imagine a more stupid or dangerous way to make decisions than to put those decisions into the hands of people who will pay no price for being wrong."**

Indeed. No one in government today pays any price for their bad decisions. That is a failure that should be easy to correct. But do we have the political will to do so?

Think for a moment about all the election fraud that has occurred (if you disagree with that statement, let me know). The people who played any role in election fraud are simply not in fear of paying a price for their decisions. We could stop election fraud quickly. We have enough legislation. We need no more. We simply need to enforce the laws currently on the books. Find someone who violated the law, and prosecute them. There are a lot of them.

The CDC and the NIH, together with Doctor Fauci, have made more bad decisions than anyone should be allowed. And it looks like that will continue. Take, for instance the enormous fear-mongering that is coming from our government about the Delta variant of COVID. Delta is the fourth letter of the Greek alphabet. Has anyone asked what happened to the Beta variant? Or the Gamma variant? Any virologist will tell you that a virus is a living organism. And every living organism has two things that are inbred as important: 1) Staying alive, and 2) Procreation. It does a virus no good to kill its host. Therefore, successive variants will be less fatal, not more. They will also be more contagious, not less. Therefore, we can expect more people to catch the Delta Variant, but fewer people to die from it. And that is what is being reported from around the world. And we, here in the US, are being lied to.

It is no longer wrong to lie, either to congress or to American citizens. Happens every day. And nothing is done.

Should conservatives ever regain control over the levers of power – an increasingly unlikely event – I would like to see those currently working so hard to undermine our founding principles go to jail. Our government has a written contract with its citizens. That contract is called the Constitution. It is as valid as any other properly executed contract, and arguably much more important.

Anyone seeking to disrupt that contract should face a criminal charge. Tortious interference with a contract occurs when a third party intentionally damages the contractual relationship between two parties. You and I were born with a written contract to protect us. A contract with our government, and with our God. Anyone seeking to undermine that contract should face the full force of the law.
